## Morning Meetings

This year, students in each classroom will begin their day with a morning meeting. Morning meetings provide a chance for students to build relationships with one another and to learn social and emotional skills. At the morning meeting, students greet one another, have the chance to share how they are feeling or something that they are excited about, and review what will happen during their school day. Please feel free to check in with your child's teacher about their morning meetings at Curriculum Night.

## WIN Groups

This week, students in grades 1-5 completed iReady testing. This assessment gives us more information about each student's strengths in the areas of reading and mathematics. Our teachers use this information to help them identify the next steps for instruction for each child. Beginning on September 16, students will participate in a WIN (What I Need) group to strengthen their skills in reading (Last year, these groups were called Reading Intervention groups). WIN Groups will last for 6 weeks. During this time, your child will receive instruction from one of our classroom teachers or paraeducators on an area that iReady and teacher assessment data shows is an area for growth. We are excited to offer the opportunity for every child to work on skills-based learning in addition to their regular reading instruction.

## Curriculum Night

We hope that you can join us for Curriculum Night on September 12, 2019. This night is an opportunity for parents to see what their child(ren) will be learning throughout the school year. Teachers will present curriculum, routines, rules, and expectations. Each class will host two, twenty minute presentations. *These presentations are geared toward adults, it is not recommended to bring children.*
